Or in the South Island, the breathtaking beauty of its snow-capped mountain ranges and fiords and waterfalls of Milford Sound. Whatever your delight, there are many memories to take away and treasure.

Day 1: Welcome to Christchurch

Meet your Travel Director and travelling companions this evening at a Welcome Reception and dinner. Hotel: Ibis Hotel, Christchurch. D

Day 2: Christchurch – Omarama Drive over the rich alluvial farmlands

of the Canterbury Plains to spectacular Lakes Tekapo and Pukaki. Pause to view the iconic Church of the Good Shepherd before revelling in the magnificent alpine landscape of Mt. Cook National Park. Hotel: Heritage Gateway Hotel, Omarama. B D

Day 3: Omarama – Dunedin

Travel via Oamaru, with its famous white limestone buildings, to Dunedin, a region of unique landscapes and fascinating cultural history. Take an orientation tour, then enjoy quiet time to explore the city or relax at your hotel. Hotel: Kingsgate Hotel, Dunedin. B D

Day 4: Dunedin - Milford Sound

Be awestruck today by the glories of the superb World Heritage listed Fiordland National Park. Journey through rainforest, ancient glaciers and mountain ranges, and pass through the monumental Homer Tunnel. See Lake Matheson, Pop's Lookout, Cleddau Valley and the Chasm before arriving in Milford Sound for your unforgettable overnight cruise. (Please note: Cruise does not

operate 21 May-15 September. During this period, there will be a day cruise on Milford Sound and accommodation in Te Anau or Queenstown). Cruise: Overnight Milford Sound. B D

Day 5: Milford Sound – Queenstown

Depart this morning for serene, majestic Lake Te Anau. Explore the famous Te Anau Glowworm Caves by boat with a local guide before travelling on to Queenstown, the adventure capital of the South Island. Hotel: Copthorne Hotel and Resort, Queenstown, 3 nights. B D

Day 6: Queenstown Free Time

Today is yours to explore Queenstown at your own pace. You may like to consider taking one of our optional experiences – you could ride the Shotover Jet boat, join a wine tour or take a 4WD minibus excursion through Skippers Canyon. This evening you have the option of taking a peaceful cruise across Lake Wakatipu aboard the TSS Earnslaw to Walter Peak High Country Farm for a gourmet barbecue dinner. B

Day 7: Queenstown Free Time

Day 8: Queenstown - Franz Josef

Your destination is the wild West Coast of the South Island. Stop to visit the gold mining settlement of Arrowtown, and enjoy the serenity of the region's vivid blue lakes. You will then travel over Haast Pass and view the sheer drop of Thunder Creek Falls on your way to the Franz Josef Glacier. Hotel: Scenic Franz Josef Glacier. B D

Day 9: Franz Josef - Punakaiki

Explore this astounding glacier on foot or from the air this morning (both optional). Travel to Hokitika, home of New Zealand's famous greenstone, then on to Punakaiki to view the intriguing Pancake Rocks and Blowholes. You'll spend the night in an eco-friendly resort right on the waterfront. Hotel: Punakaiki Resort. B D

Day 10: Punakaiki - Nelson

This morning the Heritage Highway leads you through a scenic wilderness to the plunging Buller Gorge and pristine Kahurangi National Park. This afternoon in Nelson you'll visit the quirky World of Wearable Arts and Classic Cars Museum. Hotel: Grand Mercure Monaco Resort, Nelson. 2 nights. B D

Day 11: Nelson Free Time

On this day at leisure, you'll have the option of journeying to the top of the South Island and enjoying a cruise in the Abel Tasman National Park. Or you could take a short bush walk, or relax in sunny Nelson and explore its many art and craft galleries. B

Day 12: Nelson - Wellington

Visit the seaside village of Picton and cruise on tranquil Queen Charlotte Sound before heading across Cook Strait to the North Island and Wellington, New Zealand's capital. Enjoy a city sights tour before a guided tour of Te Papa Museum of New Zealand, where you'll explore New Zealand's nature, art, history and cultural heritage. Hotel: Travelodge, Wellington, 2 nights. B D

Day 13: Wellington Free Time

Wellington is celebrated as the country's creative and culinary capital and today is yours to explore the city at your own pace. You might like to take a tour of Parliament or the Weta Workshop, creators of special effects for The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit films. B

Day 14: Wellington - Napier

Travel through the Wairarapa region and Hawkes Bay to Napier, a city whose unique concentration of beautiful Art Deco architecture is due to its rebuilding after the 1931 earthquake. Enjoy a walking tour with a local guide. Hotel: Scenic Hotel Te Pania, Napier. B D

Day 15: Napier - Rotorua

Today, journey to Lake Taupo, the largest lake in New Zealand, and then visit mighty Huka Falls on your way to Rotorua, where a sightseeing tour will include views of Lake Rotorua. Hotel: Ibis Hotel, Rotorua, 2 nights. B

Day 16: Rotorua

(3) Visit Te Puia, the Māori Arts and Crafts Institute, where talented students carry on age-old traditions of wood-carving and weaving. A tour of Rotorua's active geothermal fields follows: see bubbling mud pools, spectacular geysers and crater lakes. (3) Gain a further insight into traditional Māori culture this evening while you enjoy a Highlight Dinner at the Tamaki Māori Village. B HD

Day 17: Rotorua – Auckland

Experience the Agrodome Farm Show, where an entertaining performance provides insights into agriculture in New Zealand. Later, travel through the lush dairy-farming district of Waikato en route to Auckland, where you'll take a tour of the city. Hotel: VR Queen Street, Auckland. B

Day 18: Farewell from Auckland

Say farewell to your fellow travellers when your holiday comes to an end this morning after breakfast. B
